





Digantara, startup by LPU students, raises Seed Funding of \$2.5 million




Spacetech startup Digantara recently raised \$2.5M Seed funding from Kalaari Capital. Started by LPU Alumni Anirudh Sharma & Rahul Rawat in 2018 from their dormitory at LPU, Digantara is India's first air and space surveillance company.

The funding will accelerate Digantara's product development and enable them to launch their first satellite (technology demonstration mission) to LEO, sooner than expected. Overall this will strengthen Digantara's efforts in making space operations safer and increasing orbital sustainability.

"Just like the aviation sector,

Digantara plans to use a hybrid mechanism of tracking objects using its own satellites

Space inevitably requires an efficient traffic management system. At Digantara, we are pioneering an active surveillance technologybased in space to provide precise orbital insights to ensure continued safe space operations," Anirudh Sharma, chief executive officer, Digantara, was quoted as saying by the magazine *Entrepreneur*.

Black holes are dark objects in space that have intrigued scientists for centuries. Studying them is like trying to solve a puzzle made of invisible pieces. Black holes hide behind a wide surface called the Event Horizon. Nothing that crosses the Event Horizon ever makes it back out. Not even light can escape a black hole's gravitational force.

In Theory of General Relativity,

Einstein showed us that what we perceive as gravity is actually the effect of the curvature that an object creates in spacetime. The more massive the object, the bigger the curve hence the more gravity it exerts. At their core, black holes are points where spacetime curves infinitely. This, like dividing by zero, is not mathematically possible. We named this area where our laws of physics and -, -- -----

mass of our sun in the diameter of a city. They form when a star with three times the mass of sun or larger, reaches the end of its life. The Milky Way galaxy contains a "few hundred million" stellar black holes and a supermassive black hole at its centre called Sagittarius A*. Black holes can come in a range of sizes, but there are three main types. The most common type of medium-sized black holes is called "stellar." These exciting discoveries slowly bring us closer to understanding the mysteries that lie beyond the event horizon. To re-imagine how the world is, we live in works.
