While Chopra was awarded ₹ 50 lakh and a gold javelin for winning the only gold for India at Tokyo Olympics, Manpreet Singh and nine other





t was a moment of extreme delight for all in the LPU Family when HRD Minister Shri Dharmendra Pradhan announced the NIRF India Rankings 2021. As per the rankings, LPU continues to feature among the prestigious NIRF List of Top 100 educational institutions in India overall, across all government and private colleges and universities.

In a major feat, the University's Architecture, Law and Pharmacy schools have been ranked amongst the Top 25 in the country for the first time. Amongst universities both government and private, LPU has strengthened its LPU has been ranked ahead of some of the well-known and famous engineering and management institutes in India

ranking to 62 this year from 87 in 2020.

The University's Management and Engineering schools have also received a much higher ranking this year with the Mittal School of Business having been ranked 37 in the country while the Engineering faculty being ranked 66.







"Humanities is the next big thing as a career option for students"

Pavitar Parkash Singh, more popularly known as PP Sir, believes that India should go back to offline mode of education when the crisis of COVID is over

what the past year has been like in terms of student choices - highlighting the challenges and how you managed to turn things around? PP SINGH: Due to lockdown, students had to go for online classes. They faced lots of challenges related to class conduction, students' involvement, which impacted teacherstudent relationship. So, major thrust was given to make the lectures more interesting and compact with detailed and systematic presentation.

- Importance have been given to make further rapport at the initiation of the classes so that a psychological bonding can be framed.
- Continuous classes and sincere approach to them was required for their sustained involvement in the academics.
- Periodic evaluations and preparations also felt them to be in the course, just like offline.
- Network system with the Faculty Members along with close and intimate supervision of the Senior faculty of LPU also facilitated the entire programme a successful one.
- While it took little time for me to be accustomed with the system, after some time, I got pleasure of interacting in this format and it was further strengthened with the positive feedback and students involvement in academics.

Humanities has got immense career provisions and probably more than the science, in the professional fields LOVELY WORLD: Let's speak about Social Sciences. Which is the most popular program among graduates and the reason behind it?

PP SINGH: The most popular course is Clinical Psychology. Students are taking a lot of interest in this subject because many interesting theory and mental disorders & therapeutic applications are there which have predominant career option as a Counsellor or Clinical Psychologist.

weightage should be given to practical in today's education system?

PP SINGH: Practicals are equally important with the theory, otherwise application to the theory cannot be demonstrated to students.

Now the career options are much more application-based, where practicals are very much essential to provide hands on experience to the students.

LOVELY WORLD: What students should expect when studying Humanities?

PP SINGH: In recent years, Humanities has got immense career provisions and probably more than science, in the professional fields. Now students are taking Humanities as a first option, leaving other lucrative and most preferred options like Medical and Engineering.
Another advantage of Humanities is that students of this field can get a broad spectrum of careers after successful completion of their courses.

Humanities' students are the prime need of our country because this particular course rehearses our cognitive functions more in a rational and panoramic way.

LOVELY WORLD: What is your view on the future of education in India (e.g., is it moving towards online or offline is still the preferred choice)?

PP SINGH: Presently we are following online mode for educating students.

Due to the Pandemic, we are bound to do that as there is no other successful option beyond that.

According to me, India should go back to offline mode of education when the crisis of Covid is over, because that is the most acceptable and scientific method of providing a learning environment.

PP SINGH: The academic environment of LPU is very accepting to the students and also it is comfortable to them (e.g., students can get easy access to their requirements regarding to studies, ready access to different departments and the faculties for their clarifications).

The physical environment of LPU is also conducive for studying where students feel free and relax with their academics, recreations, accommodations and refreshments. Few other benefits include:

Continuous faculty support.
Periodic evaluation along with continuous assessment.
Placement options, Career Conferences and Symposiums.

LPU also offer a Longitudinal Career Option to students- they have been offered with various subsequent programs which can make them equipped with all necessary requirements for the career.

LOVELY WORLD: Post Pandemic, where and how do you see LPU? PP SINGH: In Post Pandemic situation, I see LPU going back to the Offline Mode of education and thousands of students coming from different parts of India and abroad.

More integrated and comprehensive education should be provided to them for their ease and understanding.

Since 2019 more than 8,500 students from across the world participated in these stages.

MEDALS FURY

Team India registered a total of 15 medals – eight gold, two silver and five bronze in the World Archery Youth Championships.
